WHAT IS KRIYA YOGA

Kriya Yoga is an ancient method of living and meditation that cultivates body, mind, intellect, and awareness of the soul using powerful meditative and yoga disciplines. It helps us to experience the three divine qualities of light, vibration and sound by using techniques of concentration, posture and breathing. This develops a onepointed mind, which enables us to penetrate the deepest levels of consciousness and to change our lives. Kriya Yoga teaches that any action, *kri*, is done by *ya*, the indwelling soul. It is a universal spiritual discipline that crosses all divisions and boundaries.
